OFFICIAL OPENING OF THE PISCATAWAY COMMUNITY POLICING SUBSTATION

Piscataway Mayor Brian C. Wahler and Police Chief Kevin Harris announced that the official opening and ribbon cutting ceremony of the new community policing substation will be held on Saturday, June 18 at 11 a.m. at the site, 1601 West Fourth Street, Piscataway.

The 30-foot-by-40-foot building was constructed by the low bidder, Security Structures, Inc., Basking Ridge, NJ and contains an office/interview room, a 30 x 20 meeting room, storage space and bathrooms. Mayor Wahler said, “The purpose of the building is to provide more security in another section of the township for residents who live a good distance from the main police headquarters building on Sidney Road. It will also allow better communication and interaction with police officers and residents.”

“We are planning to relocate the community policing staff of six officers to the new site,” said Chief Harris.

The new substation is located on the site of a decade-old abandoned gas station. The township received a \$143,000 grant from the Department of Environmental Protection to cover the cleanup of the site which was completed over a year ago.
